Holstein, in the herd of Mowery Frey, Jr, Lancaster R7, just missed the 800 lb mark. She produced 799 lbs. of butterfat in 19,920 pounds of milk.

The herd of 24 registered Holsteins owned by Christ K. Lapp, and Son, Gap R2, posted the high butterfat average for the month. The herd averaged 55 pounds of butterfat in 1,442 pounds of milk with an average test of

3.8 per cent.

The 37 cow herd of Mowery Frey, Jr. produced an average of 52 lbs of butterfat in 1,336 pounds of milk averaging 3.9 per cent test

A total of 18 cows in the association finished lactations with over 700 pounds of butterfat. Only four herds had averages of 50 or more lbs. of fat per cow during the testing month. Ten other herds averaged between 45 and 50 pounds for the month. The figures were supplied by the monthly newsletter of the testing association.
