Slaughter steer prices at the December 21 auction at New Holland continued about steady with the previous week. Cows were 25 to 50 higher, and bulls were 50 higher. Receipts included 72 head of cattle.

A few high choice and prime slaughter steers 27.10 with the bulk of the choice at 25.50-27. Good to low choice were 23.25-25 50, and standard was 20 50-23 25.

Good and choice heifers at 829-960 pounds were at 22 35-25.00. Cutter and utility cows brought 16.25-17 25 Canners and low cutters at 14.75-16.25, with shelly canners down to 11.50.

Utility and commercial bulls brought 21-24. One lot of choice 922 pound feeder steers were 24.00.

of dairy cattle prices were somewhat stronger on the 129 head of cows, nine bulls and 24 heifers.

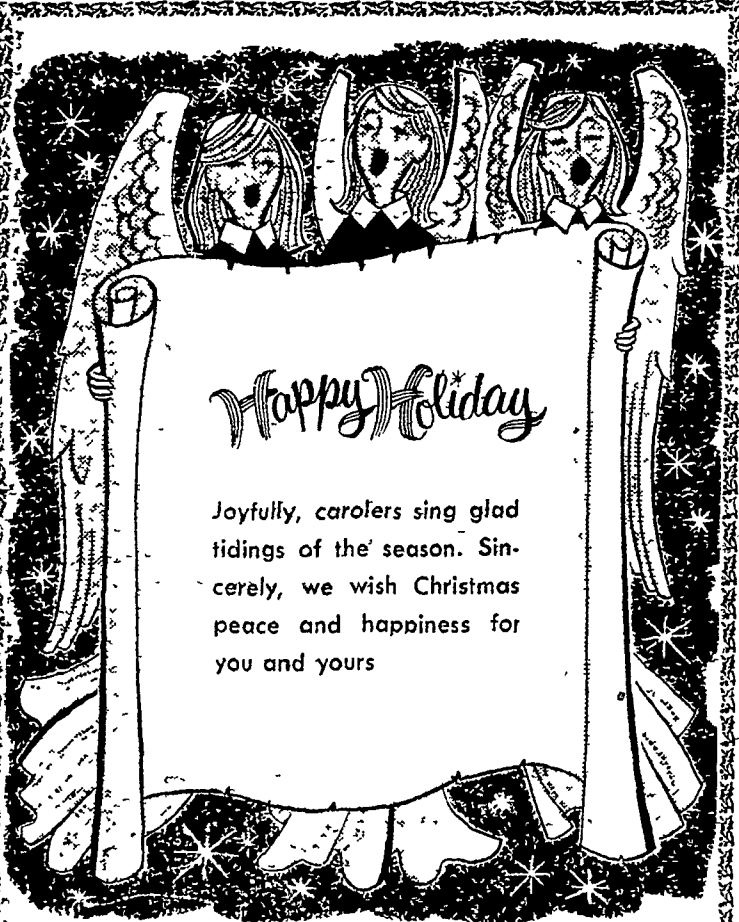
