CATTLE: 2903 — Compared with 1761 head last week supply includes 35 percent slaughter steers and 55 percent stockers and feeders. Trading slow. Slaughter steers showing some fill. Compared with last weeks close slaughter steers were steady. Cows 50 higher. Bulls and stockers and feeders steady.

Slaughter steers grading strength at the January 1 high choice and better continued fully steady with the previous week's market at the January 4 auction at New Holland. Average choice and below were 50 lower to instances 75 lower. Cows were 1.00 lower and bulls were steady.

Choice and prime slaughter steers weighing 900 to 1,100 pounds brought 27.60 to 28. The bulk of the choice at 950 to 1,350 pounds made 25.25 to 27. with a few head going to 27.10 to 27.50. Good to low choice brought 23. to 25.50 with standard at 20.50 to 23.00

Cutter and utility cows were 16 to 17.25 with canners and low cutters 14.50 to 16 and shelly canners down to 11.00

Utility and commercial bulls brought 20.50-24.

A few loads of good and choice 850 to 1,038 pound feeder steers brought 23.24-10

Calves: 323 Vealers grading choice and prime were 2.00 lower. Good and choice vealers brought 30 to 37 with the bulk of the choice at 37 to 39.50. Odd head of prime went to 43.50 to 44.50. Standard and low good were 25 to 30 and standard sold at 20-20.25

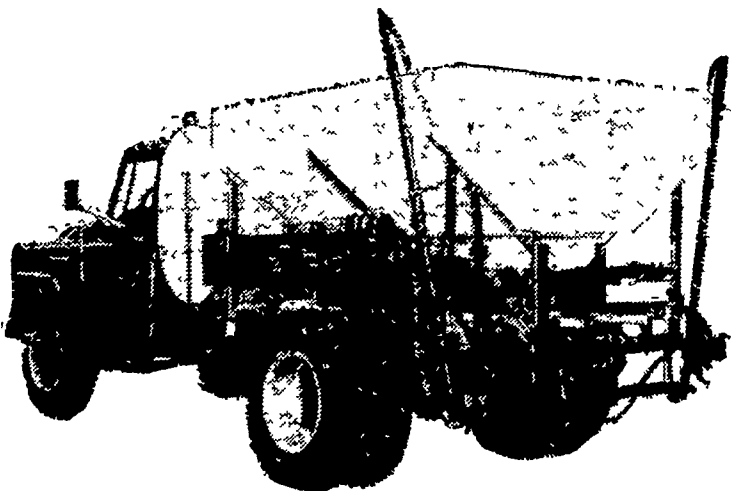
