

DeKalb 131 Layers were at the top in the recently completed 6th Wisconsin Random Sample Test. Their total henday production from housing was 278 4 ... the highest record ever made in this test.

During the laying period of this 500 day test, 80.3% of the DeKalb 131 eggs were large or extra large; and in the final 19 days in July 1961, 98.5% were large or extra large. Mortality of DeKelb 2212 et 29% mort tool for the DeKalb 131's at 2% was tied for the lowest in the test. Average of all 26 entries on mortality was 12.6%. Exam-ination at the end of the test showed 47 of the 40 DeKalb birds to be in good laying condition. Comparisons of the DeKalb 131 Layers and the test average are shown on the left.
