## Imported Meats To Be Marked

Beginning March 1, consumers of Federally graded meat will be able to tell if what they buy is of foreign origin The U S Department of Agriculture today announced an amendment to Federal meat grading regulations which will require that all imported meats be marked as such.

The original proposal called for the amendment to go into effect Jan. 1, 1962, but in order to permit handlers of imported meats to obtain suitable marketing equipment, the date was delayed until March 1, 1962.

The Amendment will: 1. Require imported meats to bear an approved mark identifying the country of origin on most of the major retail cuts if the meat is to be Federally graded; 2 Require the applicant for meat grading service to notify the meat grader if the carcass or the wholesale cuts offered for grading are of foreign origin; and 3. Provide for denial or withdrawal of meat grading service from any applicant who knowingly fails to provide the required information regarding imported meat.

the pens of littermate gilts will hold the spotlight.

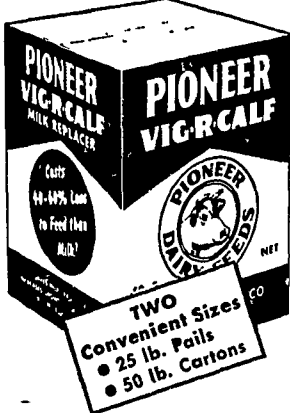
