**WEEKLY REVIEW.** **CATTLE**—Following last weeks lower market, cattle supplies declined Receipts were 11 per cent less than last week and 7 per cent smaller than the corresponding year ago period.

Slaughter steers and heifers fully steady to 50 higher as the result of curtailed receipts and a higher dressed beef trade, steers grading average choice and better in best demand along with comparable grade heifers Cows mostly steady. Bulls steady to 50 higher. Vealers steady. Stockers and feeders fully steady.

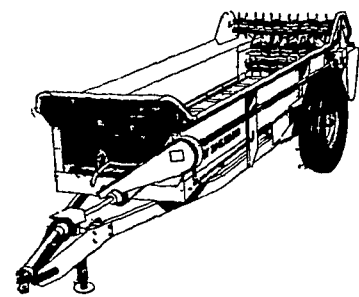

## Vintage Livestock Most Kinds Are Steady, Strong

Slaughter steers continued steady compared with the previous weeks auction at Vintage Cows were strong and bulls were steady. Receipts at the January 23 sale were 523 head of cattle.

Few high Choice and Prime 950-1100 lb. slaughter steers 27 50-27 60, Bulk of the Choice 950-1350 lbs at 25 75-27 00, few to 27 35, Good to low Choice 23 75-26 00, Standard 21 00-23 75.

Cutter and Utility cows, at 15 75-17 00, Canner and low Cutter 14 25-16 00, Shelly canner down to 11 50, Utility and commercial bulls at 19 50-22 50 Good and Choice 856-1109 lb feeder steers 24 00-25 25.

**CALVES.** 351. Vealers grading average Choice and Better 1 00-2 00 lower. Low Choice and below 1 00-2 00 higher, Good and Choice vealers 33 00-39 00, Bulk of the Choice 39 00-41 50, few Prime 43 00-44 00, Standard and low Good 28 00-33 00, Utility 23 00-28 00.

## New Holland Slaughter Steers Steady

Slaughter steers continued on a steady market at the January 25 auction at New Holland. Canner and cutter cows were 25 higher, but utility and standard sold to 25 lower. Bulls were 25 lower. Receipts included 1232 head.

Choice slaughter steers weighing 950-1350 pounds brought 25 75-27 with a few head to 27 35. Good and low choice slaughter steers were 23 75-26 while standard made 21-23 75.

Choice heifers weighing 900-1050 pounds made 23 10-24 10.

Cutter and utility cows were 15 75 to 17 with canners and low cutters at 14 16. Shelly canners sold down to 11 50.

Utility and commercial bulls were 19 50 to 23 with good grade bulls selling to 24.

Good and choice feeder steers at 719 to 997 pounds brought 23 85 to 25 25.

Calves: 257. Choice and prime vealers sold steady to 1 00 lower while good grade and below were fully steady. Good and choice vealers were 33-39 while choice and prime brought 39 44. Standard and low good were 27-33. Utility sold from 22 to 27.

Dairy cattle at the January 24 auction sold about steady to strong and active trading moved the 115 cows, 19 stock bulls and 13 stock heifers. Fresh Holstein cows sold

\$300 to \$550 while Guernseys made 175 285 and other breeds were \$175-300. Stock bulls brought \$125-\$210 while stock heifers crossed the block at \$75-140.

At the January 22 sale of horses, ponies and mules the 227 head crossed the block about steady prices.

Single mules change hands at \$140 to \$215 while teams brought \$300-511. Pony mares sold for \$75-113 while geldings made \$40-111. Riding horses were \$110-240 and drivers were \$110-260. Killers made 8 1/2 to 9 cents.

The supply of hogs at the January 22 auction was larger than the two previous weeks as a total of 597 head crossed the block. Most of the retail hogs sold from 19 to 23 10. These hogs would be number ones Packer type hogs—ones to threes sold 19 25.

Calf receipts included 9 head. The market on choice and prime was 40-44 with average choice at 36-40. Standard and good were 23 35 with culls and commercial kinds down to 18 or 20.
