Weekly Review: Following last weeks sharply lower prices, cattle marketings curtailed. Local receipts 13 percent below a week ago and the smallest for any four day period since April of 1955.

Compared to last weeks close, slaughter steers and heifers 25-1 00 higher with the most advance on kinds grading choice and up. This the sharpest advance for any week since September. Cows 25-75 higher, most advance on utility and lower grades. Bulls 50-1 00 higher than the low close of last week. Vealers and stockers and feeders scarce, steady.

At the February 7 auction of dairy cattle the market was slow and barely steady. A total of 77 cows, 13 bull and 17 heifers were sold.

Fresh Holstein cows sold \$300-535 while Guernsey made \$175-280, and other breeds were \$175-250. Stock bulls brought \$110-200 on stock heifers changed hands at \$45-135.

Mules and draft horses continued to sell at steady prices at the February 5 auction. There were no mares in the run of 199 head.

Mules by the pair brought \$300-550 while single mules were \$135-230. Draft horses by the team sold for \$300-480 and singles brought \$135-240.

Gelding ponies brought \$40-110, Riding horses, \$130-500, and driving horses \$130-250. Killers were 8 to 9 cents per pound.

At the February 5 hog and calf auction, hogs averaged 25 to 50 lower than the previous week. There were 580 hogs sold.

Slaughter hogs to local butchers brought 19 50 to 23 25 while 1 to 3 grade hogs to packers brought 18 50 to 18 75 with some of the leaner type hogs going to 19.

Choice and prime grade calves were steady at 38-43. Good and low choice were 35-38 and standard and low good made 24-35. Culls and common made 18-23.

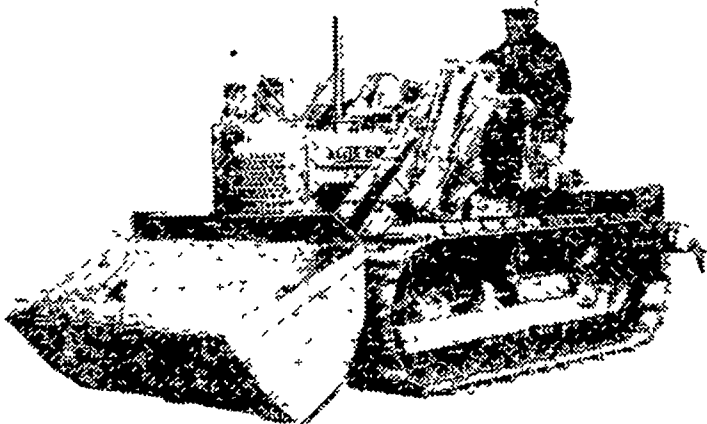

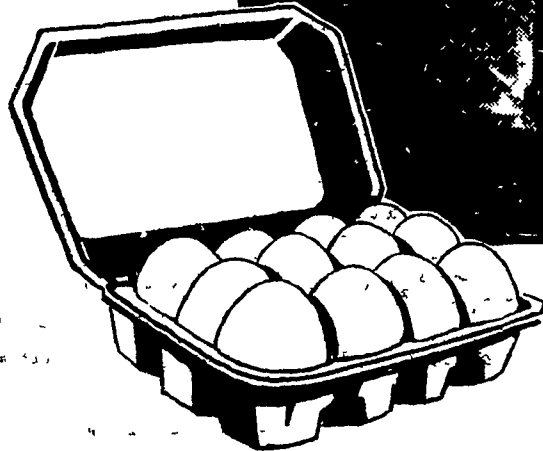
