Volume Up Prices Steady

Broilers brought 16.4 to 18.5 at farms during the 24 hour period ending 10:30 Friday morning. Sales included 840,500 head of which 853,000 head were on the Shelbyville auction Thursday.

About a third of the sales were at 17.5 to 17.9. Only one per cent was at the top figure.

The Delmarva broiler-fed ratio for the week ending February 2 was down one point from the previous week at 4.1 Broilers averaged 19.18 and mash cost the grower \$93.52 per ton. The ratio for the comparable week a year ago was 4.0 when broilers averaged 18.12 and mash cost \$90.15 per ton.
