

## Hearings Are Set On River Bridge

HARRISBURG — Secretary of Highways Park H. Martin said today that a public hearing, may be held, if requested, to determine the economic effect of the proposed construction of the Susquehanna River Bridge in the Holtwood area connecting Lancaster and York Counties.

Interested citizens may request a public hearing by submitting a written request to J. C. Whalen, district engineer, 21st and Herr Streets, Harrisburg, on or before March 8. If a hearing is to be held, the time and place will be announced later.

Meanwhile, Secretary Martin said, plans for the proposed bridge will be on display in the Eastern High School, main entrance hall, Wrightsville.

It will proceed in a north-easterly direction, following closely Township Roads 615 and 793, crossing the Susquehanna River near the southern tip of Piney Island. It will end on Traffic Route 372 near Bethesda, Lancaster County.
