**Food Prices Are Not In Orbit.**

While the thoughts of Americans may be orientated to soaring space capsules and astronauts this week, prices for many fresh produce items have settled back to earth. The same improved weather conditions required for American's spice shot permitted harvesting operations and normal shipping schedules to be re-

sumed, reports Tom Piper, Penn State Extension Marketing Agent. Lettuce, tomatoes and celery rate as better buys as shipments arrive in larger volume. Green beans, carrots, cabbage and Brussel sprouts are reasonably priced and supplies are ample. With an embargo on Cuban vegetables, cucumbers and some peppers are being imported from the Bahamas and countries of Central America. Added transportation charges promise to hold prices firm on these items.

Potato storage holdings remain eleven percent above a year ago and this basic food item is rated an excellent buy. A 2-inch rectangle Bush with melted butter. Sprinkle parsley and pimento over dough.
