CATTLE 1600 head compared to 1078 head last week. Supply includes 75 percent slaughter steers and 30 percent stockers and feeders. Trading slow. Compared with weeks close slaughter steers on Monday were 25-50 higher. Instances 75 higher early but few sales late in week were 25 lower or steady to 25 higher than last week's close. Cows 25 higher. Bulls fully steady. Stockers and feeders steady.

SLAUGHTER STEERS Choice grade 950-1350 lb 26 25-27 50. Several loads high choice 1100-1250 lb 27 75-28 25. Low high choice and prime 1150 lb 28 50. Good to low choice 21 75-26 25. But few loads late mixed good and low choice 25 00-25 25. Standard 21 50-23 75.

Weekly review. Cattle. Adverse weather conditions interrupted the normal marketing procedure and local receipts were below the previous week's small run. This is the third week in a row of moderate marketings.

High choice and prime slaughter steers 25 to 50 lower. Lower grade steady to 25 lower. Steers higher on Monday but advance more than raised on Tuesday and on Wednesday high choice and prime 25 to 50 higher. Heifers mostly steady. Cows about steady although not as active on the close as the early part of the week. Bulls, vealers, stockers and feeders unchanged.

Six loads prime 1200-1450 pounds slaughter steers on Wednesday 29 75 to set a new high since January 1961. Monday a load of prime 1250 pounds 29 60. Bulk of the choice 900 to 1100 pounds 26 25-28 50.

Loadlots heifers trading above good scarce few lots choice 25 50-27. Good largely 22-25 25.

Utility and commercial cows 21 50-16 50. Canner and cutter 13-16. Commercial bulls 19-21 50.

Choice 900-950 feeder steers 21 50-25. Medium and good 150 pound stock steer calves 22.

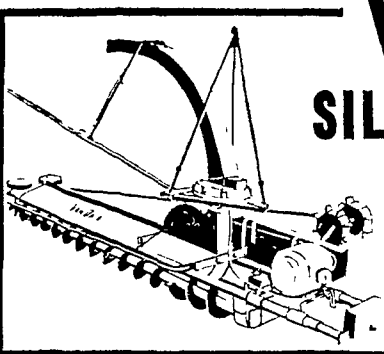

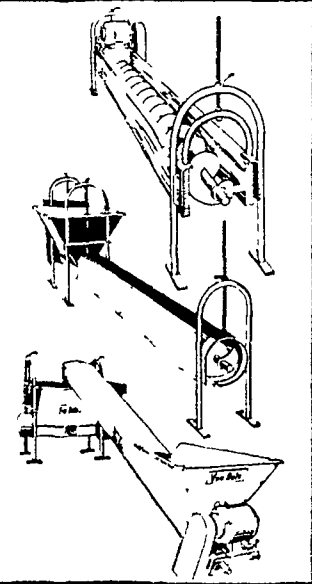

New Holland Auction

February 22, 1962. Cattle 1109. High choice and prime slaughter steers steady. All others 50 lower. Cows were steady but weak. Bulls strong.

Choice and prime slaughter steers weighing 975-1,200 lbs were 27 10 to 28 00. Bulk of the choice 950-1,300 pounds, 25-27. Good to low choice, 23-25, and Standard 21-23.

Cutter and utility cows 16 50-18. Canner and low cutter 15-16 50 with shelly canner down to 13.

Utility and commercial bulls 20-23 50 with good grade bulls 22-23 75.

Calves 324. Vealers were weak to 1 00 lower. Good and choice vealers were 33-38. Choice and prime 38-43. Standard and low good 26-33 with utility 22-27.

At the February 21 auction of dairy cattle New Holland reported receipts of 128 cows, eight stock bulls and 28 heifers. The market was draggy and lower.

Fresh Holstein cows \$300-410, Guernseys - \$175-250, other breeds \$175-270. Stock bulls - \$110. Stock heifers - \$45-110.

At the February 19 sale of horses, ponies and mules, mules brought \$300-550 by the pair and \$135-210 single. Pony mares were \$85-115 with Diller & Krieger were auctioneers.

horses \$135-285 and driving horses \$135-215. Killers brought 8 cents.

Receipts at the Monday sale included 624 hogs. The hog market was 25 to 50 lower as some retail hogs to local butchers went at 19 to 21. Number 1 to 3 grade slaughter hogs to packers brought 18 to 18 50 with some of the 2 and 3 hogs selling back to 17 50.

There were 92 calves on the steady market. Choice and prime bought 38-42 50, good and low choice 33-38, standard and low good 24-33, and cull and common 18-23.

Machinery and livestock brought good prices at the public sale of John Riehl, Willow Street Rt 1.

A tractor brought \$670; hay crumper, \$475; hay baler, \$455; manure spreader, \$302; wagon \$250; mower, \$172 and diesel engine \$505.

Mules were sold for \$450 a pair with singles bringing \$200 and \$247, cows brought up to \$387 apiece. Milk cans were sold for as much as \$8 50 each, a milk cooler for \$187. Diller & Krieger were auctioneers.
