In this society women hold a higher status than men. The

round their waist. The men wear a lot less. I cannot think of a name for the contraption. At night when it is cool, they wrap a shawl around themselves. All of this is quite a contrast to the rest of Nepal, where the women rarely show more than an ankle and marriages are arranged by the parents.

These people are very satisfied with life as it is. When one man was asked about developing his area he replied, 'Development will come when it comes but no one is in a hurry about it.' The same attitude prevailed when Village Development tried to start a market where people could trade. They have what they need and do not want any more. On the other hand I found my host father ready to accept new things more readily.

The cooperative reported a 7.74 per cent increase in first services last year. Members realized a net saving of \$45,753 or about 29 cents per first service.
