At the February 28 auction of dairy cattle 123 cows, six bulls, and two heifers crossed the block at lower prices. The market was very slow, the Sales Stable reported.

Fresh Holstein cows brought \$300 to \$420. Fresh Guernseys were \$175-225, and other breeds were \$175-280. Stock bulls brought \$110-215, and stock heifers made \$65-145.

At the February 26 sale of horses, ponies and mules, 230 head sold on a very slow market. Most interest was in meat type horses.

Mules by the pair sold for \$275-430 while single mules made \$135-185. Pony mares brought \$75-115 while gelding ponies were \$40-85. Riding horses were \$125-430, driving horses - \$125-200 and killers 8 to 9 cents.

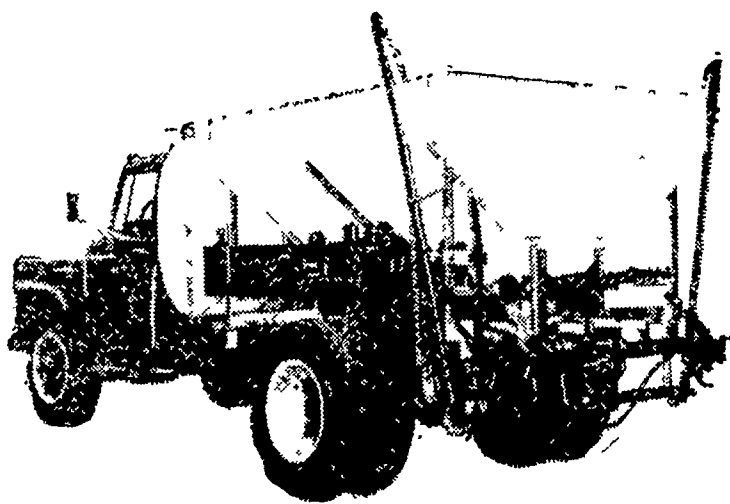
