He said, pointing to the apple marketing act of 1961 as the "most spectacular advance in the continuing campaign to promote the sale, distribution and consumption of Pennsylvania Farm Products."

An advisory committee is being set up with the industry financing the promotion and determining the course of the program. "What is happening in the apple growing industry may well serve as a guide for other commodities," Dr. Henning said.

The four points of the program outlined were:

1. A real and effective promotion program for the distribution for the sale, marketing and consumption of farm products.

2. An effective control and eradication program for all livestock and poultry diseases and an equally effective plant insect and disease control program.

3. Encourage an effective program of soil and water conservation for the benefit of all through county districts.

4. Modernize the pure food laws and provide adequate enforcement for protection of the consumer — and this includes the revision of feed, fertilizer, pesticide, lime and similar laws.

"Although the soil conservation program is nearly 20 years old, in January, 1955 only 30 of Pennsylvania's 67 counties had established districts," he said.

That number has nearly doubled. Today there are 59 counties with districts leaving only eight counties to be organized. Over 95 per cent of the farm land in the state is in the organized counties, he said.

With the expansion of the program has come the realization that the urban and rural

populations have a mutual stake in the program.

The Secretary's appearance also included the showing of The State Department of Agriculture's latest soil conservation film, "Beyond Tomorrow." It is a realistic presentation of the accomplishments in the field up to the present time.

The benefits to the public, the economy from the eradication of livestock and poultry diseases was explained in detail.

The once devastating brucellosis in cattle is close to the irreducible minimum, and work of tuberculosis is coming along, but more needs to be done on this. In 1961, the number of cases of rabies was at an all time low of 14.

The current drive for the eradication of sheep scabies is meeting with greater success than was anticipated. The department is cooperating with the U. S. Department of Agriculture and the Penn State Extension Service.

In 1954 the department checked 600 feed samples and the same number of fertilizer samples. In 1961 1300 feed and 1500 fertilizer samples were

checked by the inspectors. Plans are now being drawn for an all out attack on the Gypsy Moth, which has been confined to three northwestern counties. The plan is to remove this pest from the commonwealth.

"All these programs cost money, it is true," secretary Henning said; "The results achieved prove it is money that brings big dividends."

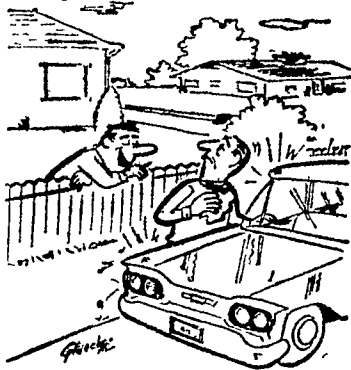

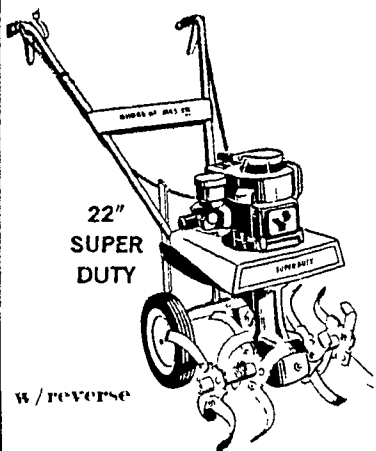

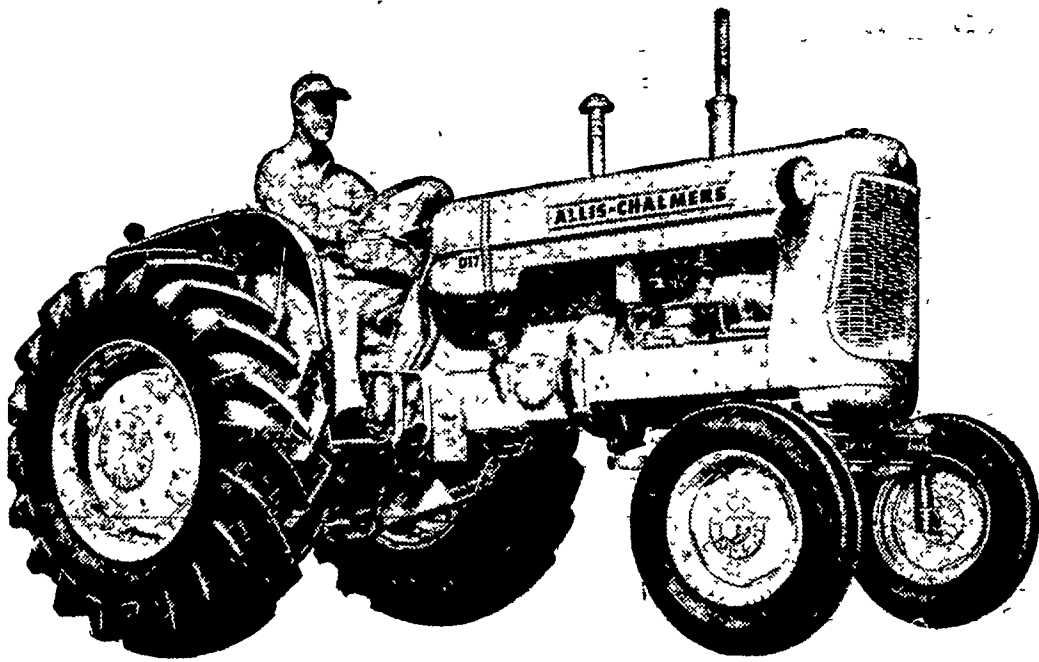
