

Miller and Bushong Increases Bulk Feed Handling Machinery

Contracts have been let by Miller & Bushong, Inc., Rohrerstown, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, for a second bulk finished feed loading station. It will consist of 18 bulk feed bins of varying capacity for a total of 320 tons with its own traveling overhead scale.

Over-all height of the structure will be 78 feet from the ground to the top of the 18-hole, electric turnhead. This will bring the total bulk load-out facilities to approximately 600 tons. The new station will enable Miller & Bushong to take care of expanding sales, increase plant efficiency and assure continued prompt service to their clients.

Sprout Waldion of Muncy, Pennsylvania is the prime contractor. Construction will start immediately.

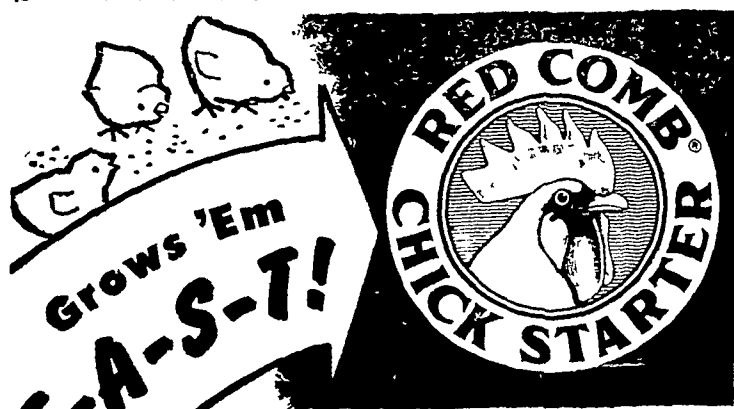

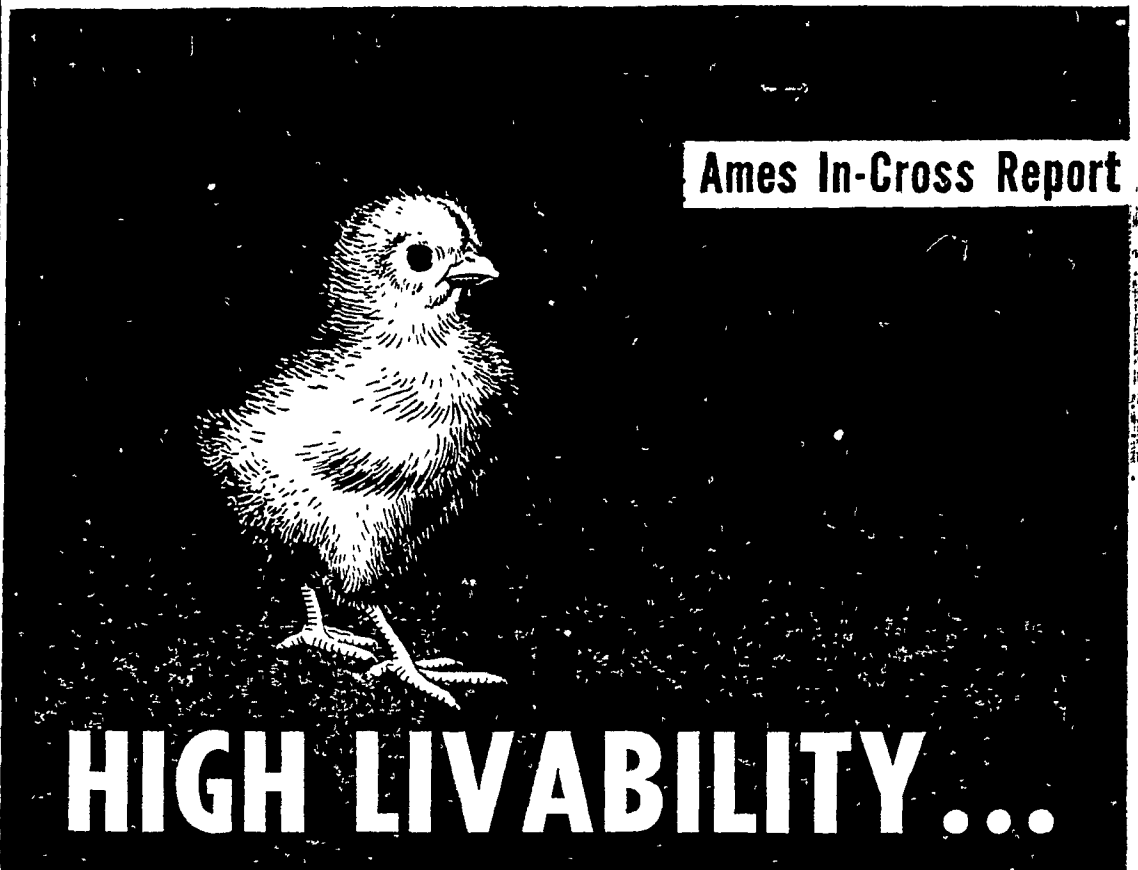
