



Why Crops Need Limestone

Two important ingredients needed by crops are calcium ind masnesium. Both of these are regularly lost through the soil by the following ways

- I By leaching (a slow leaking away - a normal process where there is rainfall)
- By crop removals (legumes such as hav and other greens are taken oft the fields instead of plowed under)
- 3 By general use of the soil

Because of this loss, the soil becomes what is known as high in acid Putting on limestone may supply calcium and magnesium and correct the soil acidity at the same time It has been shown by ex-

periments by agricultural colleges and experiment stations that for every dollar spent for limestone from \$3 to \$15 are returned to the farmer through increased yields --- td by Ivan M. Vertin
