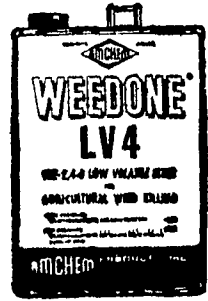
Burton Horne, Extension Agriculture Engineer from the Pennsylvania State University, was judge.
