## USDA Releases New Handbook On Pesticides

A revised handbook that brings up to date U.S. Department of Agriculture recommendations for insecticides to control crops and livestock pests is now available.

Agriculture Handbook No. 120, "Insecticide Recommendations of the Entomology Research Division for Control of Insects Attacking Crops and Livestock for 1962" lists in detail safe and effective uses for insecticidal chemicals.

This handbook has been prepared annually since 1956 by USDA's Agricultural Research Service in cooperation with the Federal Extension Service.

These recommendations, compiled as of Jan. 1 each year, are issued to guide entomologists, other research and extension workers, and various agricultural groups and agencies. However, since new insecticides developed by industry are being registered throughout the year and since the handbook does not include

all registered uses for available insecticides, users are urged to look to State extension services and other appropriate agencies for new developments and recommendations.

ARS entomologists again stress the importance of following directions and heeding all precautions on insecticide container labels. Users are told of the necessity of avoiding harmful residues on or in food and feed.

The handbook advises that insecticides should always be applied so as to minimize losses of honey bees and to avoid adverse effects on fish and wildlife.
