 other sources he added. The Conestoga study showed that 215 tons of nitrates washed downstream with the soil. According to the U. S. Geological Survey which made the measurements, 700 tons of fertilizer would be needed to replace this quantity of nitrogen.

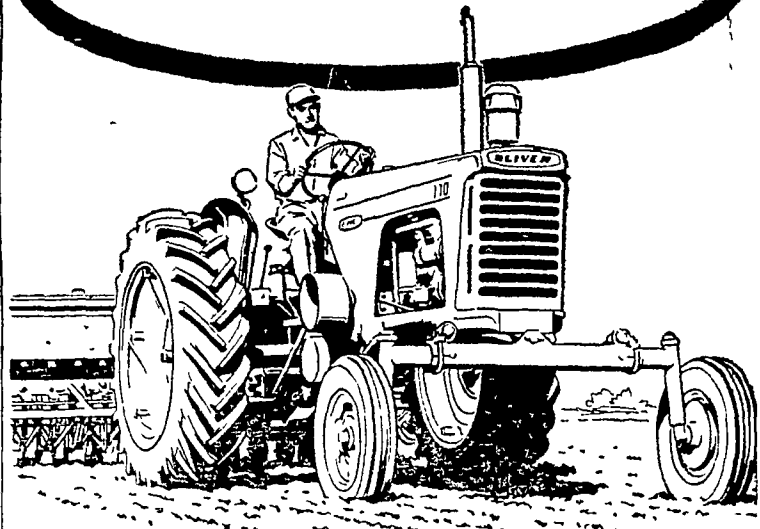
