Who will break his yield record in field corn production this year?

A grower broke his yield barrier in field corn production last year when he produced 251 bushels per acre. His high yield resulted from higher plant population and feeding the plants a special combination of Ortho fertilizers. He netted \$196 per acre after paying his plant food investment.
