## New Holland Community Club Holds Election

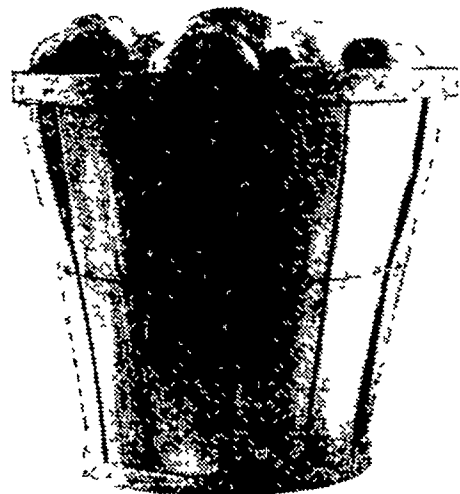
The New Holland Community I-H Club met on Monday night April 9 in the New Holland Bank building. The purpose of the meeting was to reorganize and elect officers for the coming year.
