### Survey Shows Hog Carcasses Mostly No. 1

About 33 percent of all barrows and gilts slaughtered in the United States from September 1960 to August 1961 were estimated to have been U.S. No. 1, according to a report issued today by the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

Researchers of USDA's Economic Research Service and Agricultural Marketing Service estimated that 39 percent of all barrow and gilt carcasses were U.S. No. 2, and 26 percent were U.S. No. 3.

Only a few were Medium or Cull. About 31 percent of sow carcasses were estimated to be U.S. No. 1, 35 percent were U.S. No. 2, and 24 percent U.S. No. 3.

These estimates, which are based on carcasses graded at a sample of 56 packing plants are considered accurate within about 1.5 percentage points.

Estimates of the proportion of hogs coming to market in each of the grades will help provide a benchmark by which to measure progress in hog quality improvement.

To obtain the estimates a USDA hog grading specialist visited the 56 plants and

graded about 45,000 barrow and gilt carcasses and 6,000 sow carcasses from September to August.

#### CANADIANS FLY TO COUNTY TO COMPARE CAGE VENTILATION

First stop for six Canadians on a cold, windy day recently was the Claude Hess farm, near Akron.

Hess operates a 10,000-bird cage plant that is ventilated by three regular Vent-O-Matics for year-round control, and two boosters for increased air in hot weather.

Hess has reduced floor space to 66 sq ft per bird in the cage area, and 75 sq ft per bird for the entire house area.

This 32'x240' building was found to be fresh and clean at a uniform 57 degrees F, without drafts.

The second farm visited was that of Sylvan Beiler, where a similar building is being ventilated with another type of air movement.

Before returning, the Canadians saw other types of farms and enjoyed a typical Pennsylvania Dutch "all-you-can-eat" meal.
