

# Broilers About Steady

Broiler prices continued about steady at the Lancaster Poultry Center this week as 118,520 head in 27 lots changed hands at prices ranging from 14.7 to 16.0. Five lots containing 12,920 head failed to sell at the offered price of 14.3 to 15.7.

Two lots of leghorn fowl including 2,900 head sold for 10.1 to 10.6. One lot of 250 pullets brought 23.1 and three lots of 2,110 roasters made 20.0 to 23.0.

The complete May 7 auction offered a total of 162,920 head in 13 lots and sold 124,110 head in 33 lots.

# Delmarva-Georgia Prices About 1/2 Cent Higher

Delmarva reported prices of about 1/2 cent higher during the 24 hour period ending 10:30 Friday morning.

Demand was good for the moderately heavy offerings. Prices at farms ranged 14.1 to 15.5 on 1,031,200 head.

Estimated slaughter for the week end by eastern shore processors was 729,000 head compared to 755,000 head last week end.

The Delmarva broiler-feed ratio for the week ending April 27 was steady with the previous week at 1.1. Broilers averaged 14.19 and mash cost the grower \$93.10 per ton. The week earlier broilers averaged 14.70 and mash cost \$93.97 per ton.

# Fluid Milk Production Is About Steady

Production of fluid milk was about the same as the previous week though slight increases were noted in Southeast Pennsylvania after mid week.

Cold wet weather was a contributing factor in the lack of increase in New York and New England.

Bottling demand ranged fair to good with New York and some sections of New England noting improved sales due to schools reopening after Easter recess.

# Who will break his yield record in field corn production this year?

A grower broke his yield barrier in field corn production last year when he produced 251 bushels per acre. His high yield resulted from higher plant population and feeding the plants a special combination of ORTHO fertilizers. He netted \$196 per acre after paying his plant food investment.

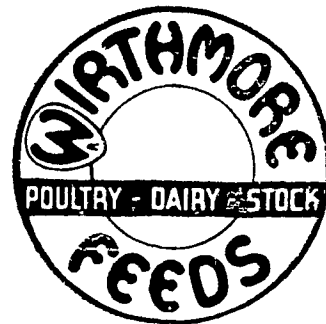
