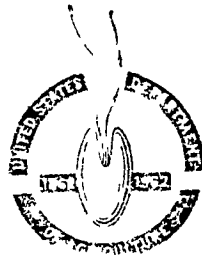

Annuals Provide Garden Colors

Quick color around your home can be obtained by planting annual flowers this spring.

Annuals provide rapid but temporary effects in the garden and also furnish cut flowers during a period when perennials generally are not blooming. Planted in clumps between shrubs and perennials, they furnish interesting spots of color and add charm, say, extension horticulturists.

Annuals are of two types — hardy and tender. Hardy annuals may be planted even when there is still danger of frost. But avoid planting tender types such as petunias, marigolds and zinnias until all danger of frost has passed.

Hardy annuals that can be planted outside now are sweet pea, sweet alyssum, candytuft, bachelor's button, forget-me-not, larkspur and poppy.

Any good garden soil will produce satisfactory annuals. They are quick growing plants and require a fertile soil that does not dry out too rapidly and yet is well drained.

If your soil is of poor quality, work in organic matter and fertilizer before attempting to plant annual seed. This will help you to get the quick color you want from annuals, the horticulturists say.

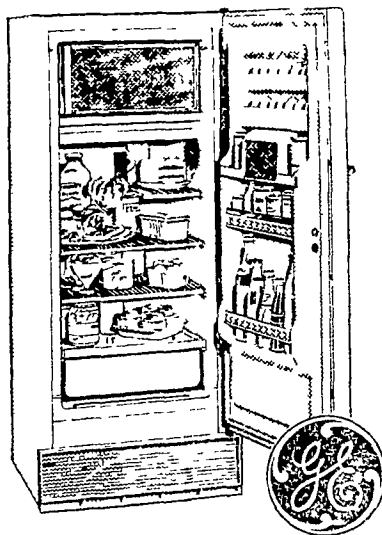

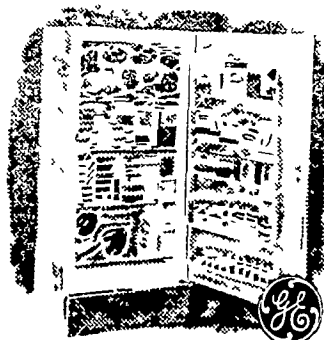
