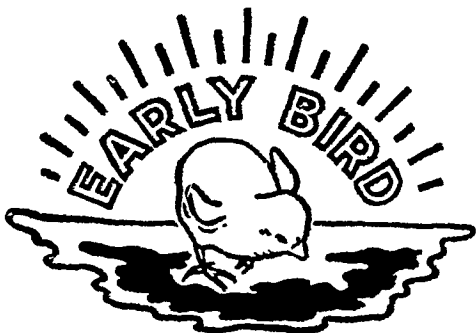

# Early Bird Poultry Feeds

	Age	EARLY-BIRD Feed	Grain	Feeding Directions
Chicks	0-6 weeks inclusive	#3. EARLY-BIRD Chick Starter (Mash or Crumbles)	None Grit twice a week.	Get chicks on feed as soon as they arrive. The first feed should be EARLY-BIRD Chick Starter. Starting on grain is not necessary.
Growing Chicks Scratch and Mash Program	7-16 weeks inclusive	#6. EARLY-BIRD Growing Mash with Coccidiostat (Mash or Pellets)	25% at 6 weeks. Gradually increase to 50% at 10 weeks	Change directly from starter to grower and start feeding grain. Keep grit before birds at all times.  For heavy breeders from 7 weeks to housing, see special instructions.
	16 weeks to laying time.	#5. EARLY BIRD Growing Mash No Coccidiostat	50-60% oats on range but not over 50% in confinement rearing	
Growing Chicks All-Mash Program	7-10 weeks inclusive	#32. All Mash Growing Ration with Coccidiostat	No grain except small amount of oats in litter to keep birds active not over 2 lbs per 100 head	If pullets seem to be developing too fast either restrict the feed intake or feed up to 25% oats.
	11 weeks to 16 weeks incl	#44. Pullet Developer Ration with Coccidiostat	Up to 25%. Grain may be fed or feed intake may be restricted.	
	17 weeks to Laying Time	#41. No Coccidiostat	Up to 25% grain may be fed or intake restricted according to rate of development of pullets	
Layers	For Market Eggs	#11. EARLY-BIRD Egg Mash	See grain feeding schedule below.	Change birds to their laying ration when laying 10 to 20%. Feed 2 lbs. of EARLY-BIRD High Producer Pellets per 100 head per day when birds reach 30% production. Feed EARLY-BIRD High Producer Pellets at noon increasing 1 lb. for each 10% of increase in egg production.
		#26. EARLY-BIRD All-Mash Laying Ration (Light Yolks)	3 lbs. oats per 100 head in morning in the litter.	
		#24. EARLY-BIRD All-Mash (Standard or medium yolk color)	3 lbs. oats per 100 head in morning in the litter.	
		#34. EARLY-BIRD Laying Concentrate.	See Special Mixing Charts.	
Breeders	For Hatching Eggs	#7. EARLY-BIRD Breeder Ration.	See grain feeding schedule below.	Change to breeder ration 4 weeks before starting to save hatching eggs. Use EARLY-BIRD High Producers Pellets as recommended above.
		#27. All-Mash Breeder Ration.	Feed 3 lbs. of oats in the morning per 100 head.

of nitrogen per acre at any early cultivation. This nitrogen should be applied before the corn attains a 100% height in order to get it closer and deeper than the corn roots. Corn is a heavy feeder of nitrogen.
