

Broilers Gain One Cent

Broiler prices advanced near-ly a cent a pound at the Lancaster Poultry Center. Broilers at the May 24 sale ranged from 16 1/4 to 17 5/8 for a net average of 17 02 compared to the 16 11 average of the previous week. A total of 100,000 head in 19 lots changed hands as all broilers on offer were sold.

Only one lot of 100 roasters sold at 20 1/4 while a total of 10,137 head failed to sell at the office prices of 15 to 19. Seven lots containing 5,680 head of pullets brought 21 to 24 1/4 for four lots of 1,150 heavy fowl crossed the block at 15 1/2 to 16 2 while 4,350 head of Lehigh tow in three lots sold at 9 1/2 to 10 1/2.

The complete auction offered 67,277 head in 12 lots and sold 97,140 head in 31 lots.

Delmarva-Georgia Prices Gain For Holiday

Delmarva reported prices of 16 to 17 1/4 at the farm during the 24 hour period ending 10:30 Friday morning. The price was approximately one cent higher than the previous report. Sales reported during the period included 1,070,000 head including 568,800 head sold at the Eastern Shore Producers Exchange Thursday. Forty-seven percent of the sales were at 16 5/8 to 16 9.

A good demand met the moderately heavy offerings with many plants killing to capacity to meet the good holiday demand. Estimated slaughter by eastern shore processors for the week end was 835,000 (Continued on page 7)

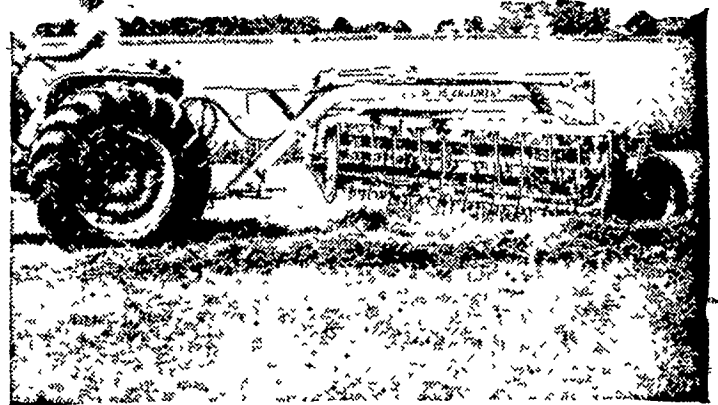
