

Mellinger Found Fire Fighters In Violation Of To Bomb Fires Stockyards Act

Jay Mellinger, Smoketown livestock dealer, has been suspended as a registrant under the Packers and Stockyards Act and ordered to cease and desist from certain violations of the act.

The suspension of registration, for a period of 20 days became effective May 30.

The order was issued April 30 by U.S. Department of Agriculture Judicial Officer Thomas J. Flavin after oral hearings on the case were conducted in October, 1961 in Lancaster.

The decision and order of the Judicial Officer requires Mellinger to cease and desist from 1 Issuing bills, accounts of sale, invoices or statements which list false weights for livestock sold at posted stockyards and 2 Receiving and accepting special or favored treatment in the handling, watering, feeding and weighing of livestock for the purpose of obtaining more favorable weights.

He was also ordered to keep accurate accounts records and memoranda in the operation of his business and was suspended as a registrant under the P&S Act with respect to activities subject to the act when the violations took place.

The action arose from a complaint filed by the Packers and Stockyards Division of USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service in Lancaster.

Seven pilots and forest officers lost their lives while engaged in an attack on forest fires in 1961.

If the radio controlled glide bomb missile now being developed measures up to expectations the Forest Service may be on the verge of a major breakthrough in forest fire fighting, the U.S. Department of Agriculture announced today.

It is expected that this missile, which will carry fire retardant chemicals, will be ready for testing on actual fires this year. A California corporation, working under contract with the Forest Service, is constructing a missile, which will be tested some time next month. If it meets requirements, five bombs will be built for further tests.

of home economics programs Federal Extension Service.

Two days will be devoted to special interest groups each group meeting for a 75-minute session. Each woman will have a chance to take part in eight different groups during the two days. The new missile is to be launched from an airplane and guided to a fire by radio. It is to be rigid to drop its 100-gallon fire retardant load before hitting the ground. Recent developments in guided missiles have made firefighters optimistic that the one now being developed will be successful.

This new method of fire attack would supplement and possibly might in time, replace direct bombing of fires with air at times dangerous because they must fly at low altitudes over rough terrain and through smoke. Use is limited because they cannot be used at night or during heavy winds.

Foresters expect they can release the missile from a plane flying as high as 3,000 feet, above turbulence from the fire and usually above the smoke.

Being a true cooperative, Production Credit returns to members any income above operating costs, Whipple explained.

The decision to pay the patronage refund was made at a recent meeting of the cooperative's board of directors.

During the year 960 members borrowed in excess of \$5,695,000 on short term loans to meet farm production expenses and to purchase livestock, machinery, and meet other general agricultural needs.

This refund is in addition to the three percent cash dividend paid to all Class A stockholders as of December 31, 1961. The dividend has been paid and will, in no way be effected by the refund.

Whipple said the refund would be paid some time in early June.

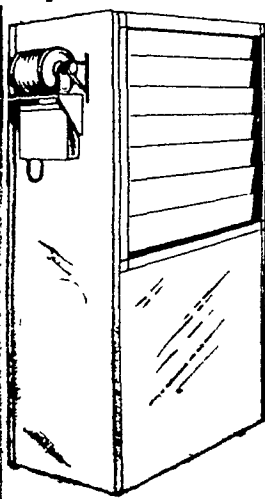
