### Best Food Buys

## Dairy Month Items Are Featured

For the twenty-sixth year, June is being observed as Dairy Month. Stocks of milk and dairy products are the largest in five years with production in 1962 likely to be around two billion pounds over 1961. Retail prices of a number of dairy products are expected to be lower in June than a year earlier, reports Tom Pipe, Penn State Extension market Agent.

June greets the food shopper with an increasing variety and volume of fresh fruits and veg-

etables, peak supplies of milk and dairy products and ample supplies of meats. As harvesting gets underway in local areas, consumers enjoy the field-peaked flavor and economical prices of many produce items.

The asparagus season is advancing rapidly. Prices are at a seasonal low and quality quite good. Those who freeze a supply for later use should order soon since quality is much higher than it will be at the close of the season.

Harvesting of the local strawberry crop is underway too. Prices are reasonable and quality improved as a result of recent rains.

Available supplies are still relatively high for so late in the season. This situation is a result of the numerous frosts. Some reduction in price and more recently dry weather over a large part of the country. Snap beans, broccoli, sweet corn, romaine and big Boston type lettuce, large size sweet onions, radishes, spinach, squash, new potatoes and leafy greens provide most economy for this time.

The amount of rainfall in the next few weeks will greatly influence the size and quality of our strawberry crop. Bananas are trying to compete with this fresh commodity by adjusting prices downward. Oranges and grapefruit remain on the list of good buys. Early-crop peaches are arriving from the southern states but the production will be less than a year ago.

With the merchandising week split by a holiday, retailers are expected to place late week emphasis on economy cut chuck roasts, round steak, ground beef, ham, pork chops and bacon. Broiler-fryers remain the best buy in poultry, although frozen turkeys remain plentiful and at low prices. Eggs continue at seasonally low prices.

### Bait Advertising

Helen Bell, Penn State extension home management specialist, explains that bait advertising offers items at a spectacularly low price or service. The seller is determined not to sell if he can help it. Among other things, bait advertising is designed to get a customer for another product, according to the Federal Trade Commission.

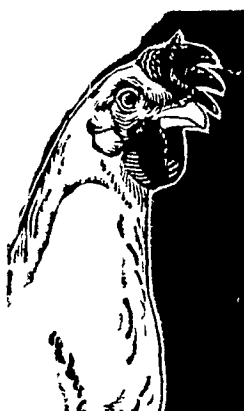
