CATTLE — Holiday week receipts of 29,000 cattle nearly as large as last week and the same year ago period. In the post-holiday trade slaughter steers and heifers lost part of sharp price gains scored early in the week, however Good to Prime steers still 25-1 00 higher than late last week. Utility and Standard steers steady to 50 lower. Heifers mostly 50-75 higher. Cows strengthened late but still steady to 25 lower for the week. Bulls steady to 50 lower. Vealers weak. Few sales. Feeding Cattle fully steady.

Several loads Prime 1325-1375 lb slaughter steers 28 35-28 75 but nothing above 28 25 in the post-holiday trade. High Choice and Prime 1150-1375 lb steers 26 50-28 25, bulk High Choice and Mixed Choice and Prime 26 50-27 50, practically everything in the steer line weighed less than 1400 lbs. Bulk Choice 950-1350 lbs 24 75-26 75, numerous loads Mixed Good and Choice 24 50-25 25, Bulk Good 22 50-24 50 mainly 23 00 up. New Holland reported a slow but steady Memorial Day market of dairy cattle. Ten stock heifers, 11 stock bulls and 112 cows were in the run.

Fresh Holstein cows brought \$275-370, Guernseys \$175-225, and other breeds \$175-225. Stock bulls brought \$110-

190 and stock heifers sold for \$75-165.

The May 28 horse sale listed 218 head of horses, ponies and mules in the run. All mules went to the killer market. Other kinds were steady to strong with pony mares at \$75-130 and gelding ponies \$40-115. Riding horses brought \$130-300 and driving horses made \$130-250. Killers were 8 1/2 cents.

The May 28 fat hog sale was reported 50 lower. There were 560 head in the run.

Retail hogs to local butchers brought \$175 to 185. Number 1 to 3 grade hogs to packers were 16 75 to 17 25. Fat hogs over 240 pounds brought 15 5 to 16 5.

The May 28 calf sale had 97 head. The market 1 00 lower on choice and prime but steady on other kinds.

Choice and prime vealers brought 34-40, good and low choice 30-34, standard and low good 24-30, and cull and common 18-24.
