Sponsored by the state association of Future Farmers of America in cooperation with

the Agriculture Education Department of the Pennsylvania State University, the annual event includes, in addition to the contests, one of the two annual state meetings of the FFA

Participation in the contests is limited to one boy for each 10 members of the chapter. Other members may become eligible to attend the convention by winning a chair in either the state band or chorus by becoming a candidate for state office, or by representing the county as either public speaking contestant or parliamentary procedure team member

The largest contingent from any one chapter in the county will be 22 from the grasslands Chapter at New Holland. The number will include 17 members of the state chorus four of them members of a quartette which will entertain the entire group at a night meeting on campus

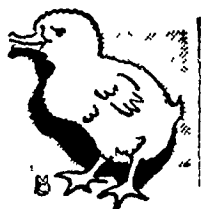

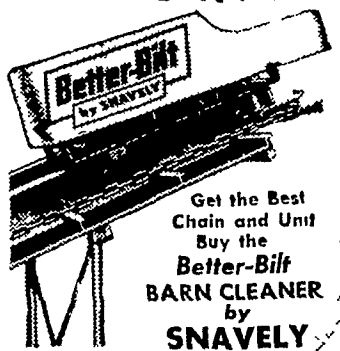
