Fresh Holsteins brought \$275 to \$375, Guernseys made \$175-225 and other breeds sold for \$175-250.

Stock bulls crossed the block at \$110-185 and stock heifers changed hands at \$65-170

A total of 237 head of horses, ponies and mules met a steady but active market at the June 25 auction All mules, continued to the killer market.

Pony mares brought \$75-125 and gelded ponies sold for \$40-125. Riding horses sold at \$130-350 and driving horses brought \$130-275.

Freezing Leftovers

Milk cartons, ordinary waxed paper, and regular wrapping paper are not waxed enough to be used for freezer cartons, reminds Louise Hamilton, Penn State extension nutrition specialist

If you use these materials for freezing leftover foods, put the packages in a plastic bag nice from holes In this way you can keep air and moisture from the food Freezer foil and freezer containers that have a tight seal protect food from drying out.

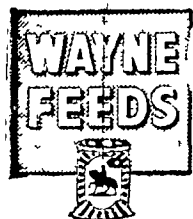
