First stop on the agenda after leaving Lancaster at 7:30 a.m. will be at the farm of Titus Beam near Elverson where 500 hogs are raised on slatted floors, over a manure lagoon. All automatic feeders, and watering in a windowless house.

In Schwenksville poultrymen will see the cage layer set up featuring 12,000 birds under forced air ventilation, controlled lighting and automatic manure disposal in five lagoons.

A tour of the automatic feed mill operation of the Bucks-Montgomery Farm Bureau and another cage layer set up will complete the tour schedule. Also at the last stop, in addition to the 7,000 layers, the touring poultrymen can observe a dairy of 33 cows and 22 heifers.

Reservations for the tour should be made with the committee or the Lancaster Poultry Center before July 21. The tour committee consists of H. Raymond Stoner, chairman; John Hess, Milton K. Hoist, David Musselman and Mark Myer.

Judge of the show will be Lawrence O. Colebank, official classifier of the American Guernsey Cattle Club. Assisting him with the judging duties on the first day of the show will be Dr. L. W. Specht, dairy specialist of the Pennsylvania State University.

Exhibitors showing more than one animal in a class may win only top premium or guaranteed money, whichever is highest, for one animal. Additional entries in the same class will receive recognition (ribbon) only. Ribbons will be awarded on the Danish system.

Exhibitors are requested to furnish their own hay and grain for their cattle, but the cooperative will provide straw for bedding, water, and a portable milking machine.

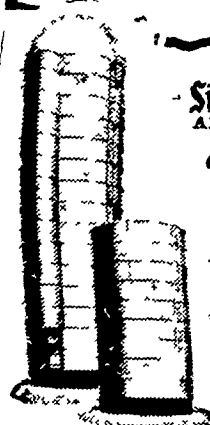
