New Holland reported a slow but steady market on dairy cows at the July 4th auction. Receipts included a 141 cows, 5 bulls and 15 heifers.

Fresh Holstein cows made \$275-400, Guernseys \$175-225, and other breeds \$175-250. Stock heifers brought \$75-175, and stock bulls brought \$115-185.

At the July 2 sale of horses, ponies and mules the 198 head crossed the block at steady prices.

Mare ponies brought \$75-125 while gelded ponies sold for \$40-125. Riding horses changed hands at \$130-300. Killer horses and mules brought 8 1/2 to 9 cents per pound.

The 416 hogs at the July 2 auction sold at 25 to 50 higher. Retail hogs to local butchers brought 20-21, U S Grade 1-3 sold at 19 50-20 50 while the heavier weights, over 240 pounds, brought 18 5 to 19 5.

At the July 2 calf auction, the 97 head met a steady market with choice and prime vealers at 33-37. Good and choice were 30-33 and standard and low good brought 25-30. Cull and common vealers were 18-25.
