E'Town FFA Members Take 4 Week Trek

Four Future Farmers from the Elizabethtown along with a chaperone from the school, began a four week experience Monday which will take them all the way to the west coast.

The trip is in the way of a reward for work on a group FFA project begun under the direction of the former teacher of vocational agriculture, Marlin G Henneinger, when the chapter decided to raise 45 acres of tobacco on the farm of Richard Breckbill, Elizabethtown R3.

Money realized from the sale of the tobacco crop will be used to defray the cost of the trip through Chicago, the badlands of South Dakota, the Worlds Fair at Seattle, the major national parks, and side trips into Canada and Mexico.

The boys, Irwin Engle Marietta R1, John Frey, Elizabethtown R1, Jay M Gish, Rheems, and Kenneth Myer, Elizabethtown R3, are being accompanied by Mr William Wertz a teacher of industrial art at the high school. Present teacher of Vocational Agriculture, who is employed by the school on a 12 month basis, is Elvin Hess.

The trip is being planned as an annual event of the Elizabethtown chapter with graduated members who have worked a prescribed number of hours on the project eligible to go.

Under class members at the school are hard at work on their crop to finance next year's trip. Willis M Hack-

man, Elizabethtown R3, is in charge of raising 35 acres of corn on the Breckbill farm while Gary Kremer, Elizabethtown R3 and Edward Shoop, Bainbridge, are in charge of growing 25 acres of tobacco on the farm of the Coble sisters.

The boys plan to camp out during the entire trip and will do their own cooking. The local office of the American Automobile Assn Club helped plan a route that would include as much Western agriculture and scenery as possible.

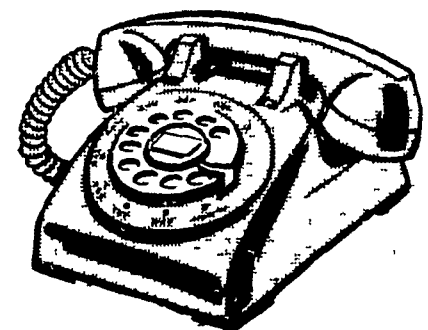

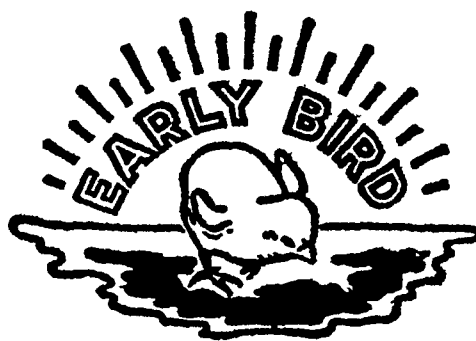
