

All Sold At Steady Prices

All lots were sold at the July 19 auction at the Lancaster Poultry Center.

Broilers averaged about the same as last week as 80,400 head in 17 lots changed hands at 17 to 18 1/2 for a sale average of 17 1/8. Almost half the sales were at 17 while only four per cent brought more than 18. The average at last year's corresponding sale was 12.62.

The high lot was 3,000 White Vantress at nine weeks of age consigned by William K. Burkholder and bought by Carl B. Risser.

Two lots containing 1,400 heavy fowl brought 16.7; two lots of roasters brought 23 and 23.1 for the 1,600 head.

In all, 83,400 head were offered and sold following is the complete sale report with lot number, seller, grower in parenthesis, amount and breed, age in weeks and days, buyer and price.

Delmarva

Prices Rise A Half Cent

Live broiler prices in Delmarva advanced sharply approximately a half cent during the 24 hour period ending 10 30 Friday morning. Moderate supplies met with a good demand.

Ready to cook interest was irregular and very competitive with other areas. Estimated slaughter by eastern shore processors for the week end was 818,500 head compared to the 819,700 head last week.

Prices on reported purchases ranged from 16.2 to 17.6 on 867,600 head at farms during the period. These figures include 561,100 head sold at the Eastern Shore Poultry Exchange on Thursday.

The Delmarva broiler-feed ratio for the week ending July 13 was up two points to 3.5. Broilers averaged 16.50 per pound and mash cost the grower \$95.51 per ton.

The ratio for the comparable week last year was 2.7 when broilers averaged only 12.73 and mash cost \$95.42 per ton.

Bottling demand ranged light to fair in metropolitan and urban areas, and good in most summer resort areas.

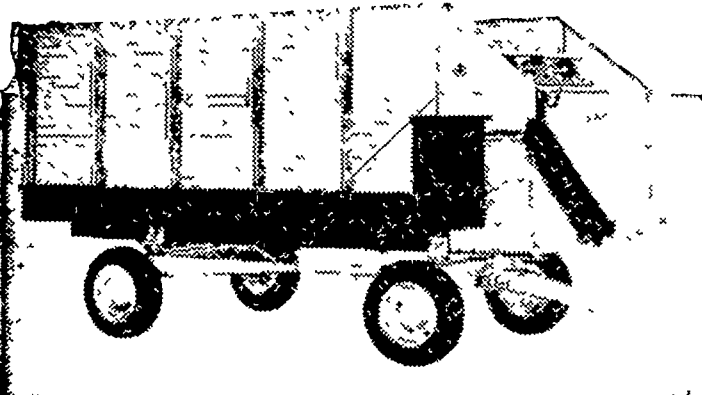
Excess over bottling needs were light and quickly absorbed by separators.
