Prune Shrubs
 Prune flowering shrubs soon after they finish flowering is the advice of A. O. Rasmussen, Penn State extension ornamental horticulturist. This practice is necessary because next year's flowering wood is produced after this year's blooming.

Heavy Feeder
 One ton of alfalfa hay removes from the soil about 22 pounds of phosphate and 45 pounds of potash, according to Wayne Hinrich, Penn State extension agronomist. These amounts are supplied in 150 pounds of an 0-15-30 fertilizer. Unless there is plenty of fertilizer, growth following the first cutting will suffer.
