The stadium program will start at 6 30 with a concert by the band and glee club. The band also will present a concert from 2 to 4 in the afternoon at the park band shell.

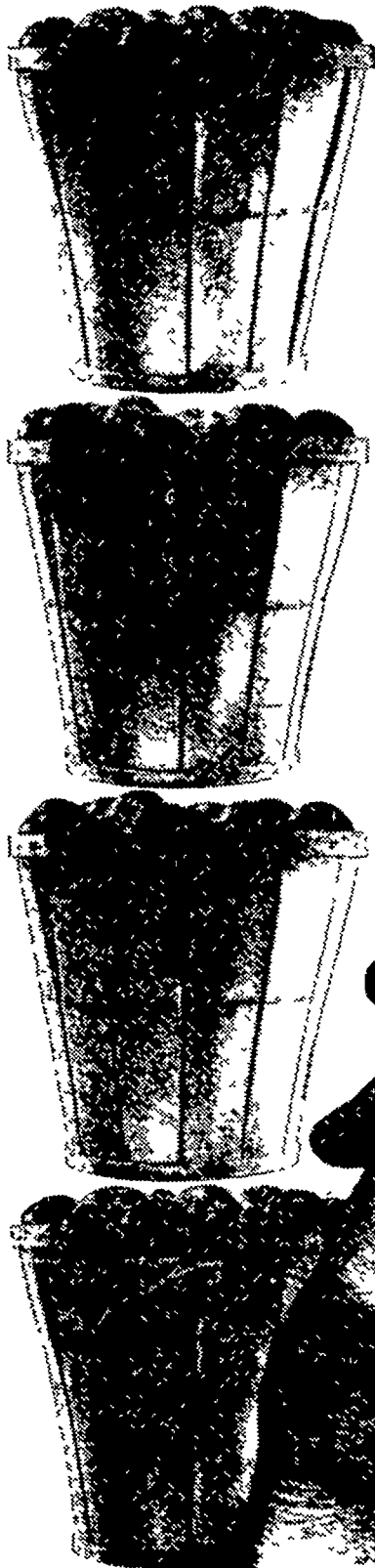
