

## Local Men Named To Board Of Pennsylvania Stock Show

HARRISBURG -- Fifteen leaders in the state's livestock industry from the Harrisburg-York-Lancaster area today were named to the staff for the sixth annual Pennsylvania Livestock Exposition Nov. 5-9 at the State Farm Show Building, Harrisburg.

Dr. William L. Henning, state secretary of agriculture, and chairman of the Pennsylvania Farm Show Commission, heads a steering committee that includes representatives of the commission and the Pennsylvania Livestock and Allied Industries Association.

The exposition, open to livestock breeders from the United States and Canada, is an international show sponsored by the Farm Show Commission in cooperation with the Department of Agriculture and the PLAlA.

Harrisburg members of the staff include Charles E.

Straub, PLAlA representative on the steering committee; John B. McCool, Farm Show manager, Dr. R. E. Elser, acting head of the state's Bureau of Animal Industry, and Dr. Richard C. Guise, state veterinarian for the Harrisburg district, all members of the health rules committee; Dale M. Ritter, chairman, swine; Dale Anderson, intercollegiate and junior judging contest, and Earnest S. Burch, finance.

Donald E. Lanus, York, 1961 exposition general chairman, is a Farm Show Commission member of the steering committee. Swine committee members include Richard Boyd, Glen Rock; Arlie Anderson, Elizabethtown; and Reno H. Thomas, Beavertown. Two are from Annville -- Dr. Dean L. Snyder, beef breeding cattle, feeder calf show and sale, and health rules, and E.

D. Williams, entertainment. Chris C. Kunzler, Lancaster, is chairman of livestock sales and a member of the carcass show and sale committee. Walter M. Dunlap, Jr., Lancaster, is chairman of entertainment and a member of the livestock sale committee. Homer K. Luttringer, New Holland, is chairman of public relations. He and Harold B. Endsow, Marietta, are on the entertainment committee. John Gingrich, New Holland, is on the livestock sales committee.

The exposition will include beef cattle, swine and sheep, with breeding stock and carcass classes in each department. A feeder calf show and sale again will be a feature. Future Farmers of America and 4-H Club members will show and sell steers they have fed as educational projects in animal husbandry.

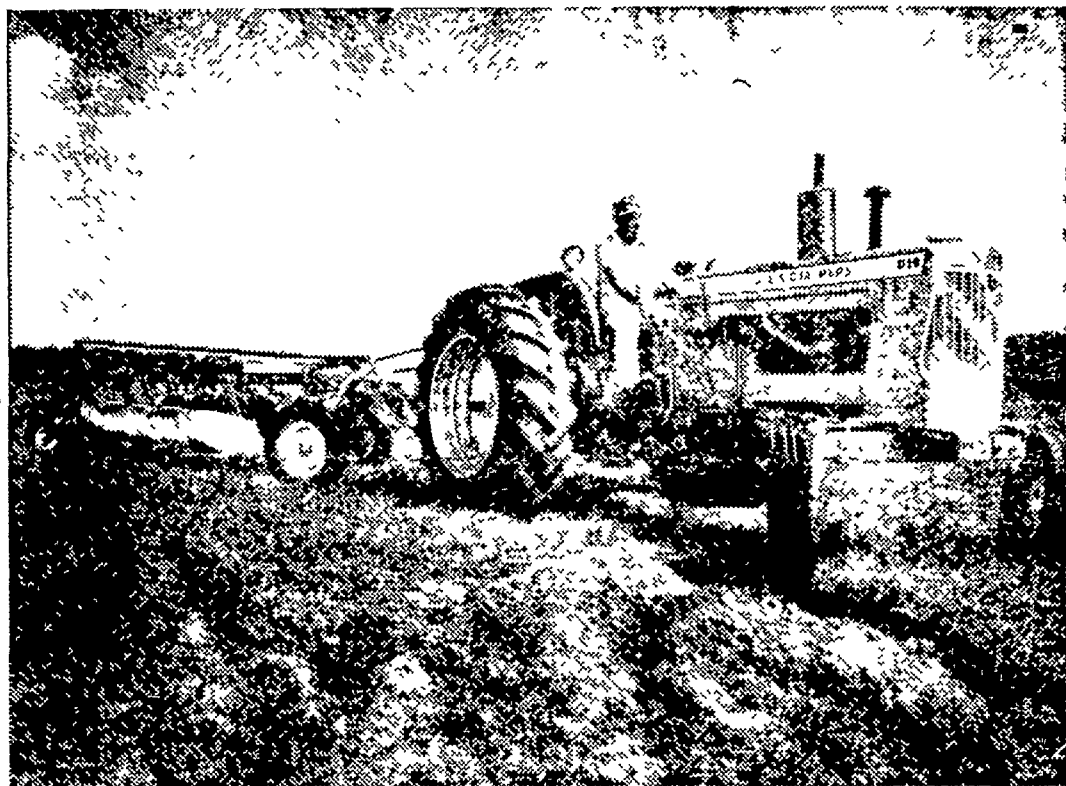

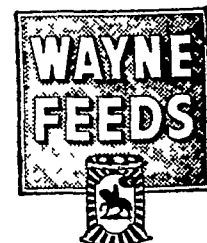
