and Jerry Snader, Ephrata R1 Coach of the team was Lewis Ayers, teacher of vocational agriculture at Ephrata High School

Dr William Kelso, extension dairy specialist at the Pennsylvania State University said, "If we could get rid of some of the low producing cows in our herds, we could eliminate the dairy surplus"

He said 31 cows producing an average of 12,000 pounds of milk will make the same return for labor as 140 cows producing at the rate of 7,000 pounds, but those 31 cows will put only 38 per cent as much milk on the market

Kelso said he believes we are going to have to start thinking in terms of the total

amount of nutrients we feed cows rather than the pounds of feed

In urging dairymen to follow a "lead-feeding" program, Kelso said, 100 pounds of body fat will produce 880 pounds of milk, but the cost must be fed ahead of her production to help her maintain her production up to her potential

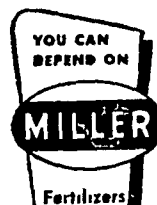
