County teamed up to show the way in county group competition. The four junior calves of Donald and Paul Trimble and Joyce Kreider all of Quarryville R1 and Phyllis Hoover Gap R1 beat out the contingent from York County.

The best local exhibitors could do in the Jersey show was two third place ribbons in class competition and a fifth place in county groups. The county was not represented in Milking Shorthorn competition.

Judge Lee Yost, Manager of Wynd Farms judging under a modified Danish system handed out five blue ribbons to Guernseys but only one to Brown Swiss and one to Ayrshire entrants from the county. A blue ribbon in the district show is the 4-H's ticket to the state junior dairy show in Harrisburg later this month.

Judge Jack Faichild, official classifier of the Holstein Friesian Association of America put the blue ribbon on one Jersey heifer and six Holstein entries from the county. Following are county placings to fifth place.

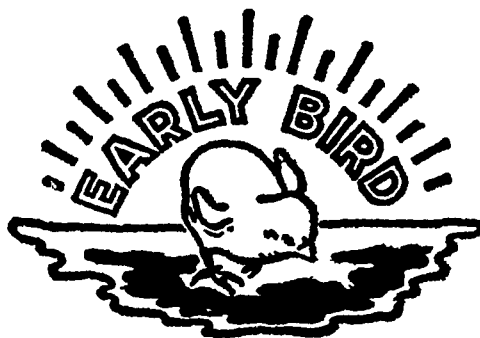
