One of the specific proposais for the hearing concerns the pricing of milk to a handler regulated by the Philadelphia the New York-New Jersey marketing area. As proposed, the Philadelphia handler would pay for milk distributed in the New York-New Jersey order Class I-A price, as is present provided.

Another proposal concerns the pricing of inter-market purchases and sales by a Philadelphia handler of milk from both the New York-New Jersey and the Philadelphia regulated markets

It is also being proposed that the Philadelphia order be amended to provide for the regulation of a plant under the milk oider for the marketvolume of fluid milk products is distributed from the plant.


Brucellosis Gets New Head

HARRISBURG -- Emphasis will continue on brucellosis eradication with a view to achieving certified brucellosis order which is distributed in free status for the whole state, Dr. Richard C. Guise, new head of the brucellosis control division, Bureau of Animal Industry, Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture, said today.

The state won certification in 1958 as a modified brugellosis free area (with herd infection of five per cent or less and cattle infection of one percent or less). Meanwhile, three countres -- Forest, Monroe and Philadelphia -- have attained certified free rank (with herd infection of one per cent or less and cattle infection of two-tenths of one per cent or less).
