Potato Spraying Keeps Sprouts Controlled

Maleic hydrazide sprayed on green potato vines in the field will control sprouting of the tubers in storage, says Elmer Pifer, extension agronomist. This chemical will prevent sprouting of potatoes for 6 months longer than untreated potatoes even at storage temperatures of 55 to 65 degrees Fahrenheit.

Maleic hydrazide is of value for table stock potatoes which must be stored for several months. It has a distinct advantage for potatoes for the potato chip processor by allowing potatoes to be stored at relatively high temperatures which prevent the accumulation of sugars in the tubers.

It must NOT be used on potatoes which will be used for seed as it will hinder their desired sprouting, Pifer cautioned.

This chemical should be sprayed after the tubers have formed and while the vine is green to allow movement of the maleic hydrazide into the tuber. Spraying should be done at least a week after blossoms fall. For varieties where flowering does not occur, apply 4 to 6 weeks before potatoes are mature and ready for harvest. Maleic hydrazide should be applied when no rain is expected for 24 hours.

Maleic hydrazide is sold commercially as MH-30.

Be sure to follow the manufacturer's label directions in the use of maleic hydrazide as a sprout inhibitor, he said.
