New Holland reported a steady market on dairy animals at the September 5 auction There were 157 cows six bulls and eight stock heifers in the run

Fresh Holstem cows brought \$275-420 while Guernseys sold for \$175-260, and other breeds made \$175-270 Stock bulls were \$110-180, and stock heifers were \$60-

130. At the September 3 sale of horses, ponies and mules, the crowd far outnumbered the 247 head in the sale run. The holiday crowd was one of the biggest in the history of the sale. Prices were about steady.

Mare ponies brought \$75-115 and geldings made \$40-115. Riding horses were \$115-225, and riding horses brought \$115-295. All mules went to the killers. Killer horses were 7½ to 8½ cents.

Why Crops Need Limestone

Two important ingredients needed by crops are calcium and magnesium. Both are regularly lost through the soil by the following ways:

- (1) By leaching, which is a slow leaking away, a normal process where there is rainfall.
- (2) By crop removals, Legumes, such as hay and other greens, are taken off the fields, instead of plowed under.
- (3) By general use of the soil.

Because of this loss, the soil becomes what is known as high in acid. Putting on limestone may supply calcium and magnesium and correct the soil acidity at the same time.

It has been shown in experiments by agricultural colleges and experiment stations that for every dollar spent for limestone, from \$3 to \$15 are returned to the farmer through increased yields.

The U.S. Government is so thoroughly convinced of the worth of applying limestone that about one-half of the cost is granted free when application is made for it. This is to encourage farmers to be certain to use limestone.

It does pay to use limestone!
