What Is Agricultural Limestone?

"Agricultural Limestone" is the descriptive term applied to two types of lime used for soil improvement:

(1) Carbonate type, such as limestone marl or oyster shells.

(2) Oxide type, such as burned lime or hydrated lime. "Martin's Agricultural Limestone" belongs

But most important of all was the evidence that the lack of any kind of lime so often seriously limited the yields in most crops.
