 New Holland reported a slow but steady market on dairy cattle at the September 12 auction. The run included 170 cows, one stock bull and 24 stock heifers.
 Fresh Holstein cows brought \$275-500, Guernseys were \$175-225, and other breeds \$175-245. Stock bulls brought \$110-185 and stock heifers made \$15-130.
 There were 253 head in the run at the September 10 auction of horses, ponies and mules. Riding horses and killers ranged lower but other kinds continued about steady.
 Pony mares brought \$75-115 and geldings sold for \$40-110. Riding horses changed hands at \$115-225 and driving horses were \$115-180. Killers brought 7 to 7 1/2 cents a pound.

WEEKLY REVIEW

CATTLE Cattle receipts sharply increased this week following very small receipts previous week which included holiday Monday and largest locally for any week since January. Salable receipts first four days 37 000 compared to 21 100 a week ago and 38,500 a year ago. Twelve market receipts 233 000 compared to 160,400 a week ago and 222,500 a year ago.

Trading on slaughter steers uneven. High choice and prime 1200 lbs up mostly steady to 50 lower except few loads average prime to high prime 1250-1400 lbs fully steady. All others 50-1 50 lower most downward pressure on wgt. under 1150 lbs. Spread in steer prices now largest since last spring. Heifers 50-100 lower. Cows 25-50 higher, under influence of higher prices for cow beef. Bulls strong to 25 higher. Few vealers fully steady. Feeders steady to 50 lower.
