### Solanco Swine Show Won By Robert Groff

Robert Groff, the 15 year old son of Mr. and Mrs. Sam-

uel Groff, Peach Bottom, showed a pair of Chester White market hogs to the grand championship of the first Market Hog class at Solanco Fair Thursday.

The initial show for market hogs drew a total of 32 head with an average weight of 212 pounds. The hogs were sold at auction Friday afternoon, but sale results were not available at press time.

The reserve champion pen of two Berkshires was exhibited by Kenneth Rutt, Quarryville R2.

In the breeding hog classes, the top sow and litter was a Chester White exhibited by John Hastings, Jr., Kirkwood R1.

A junior Yorkshire Boar shown by Paul Welk, Strasburg R1, was the champion male of the show. Welk also showed the champion Yorkshire sow, but lost out in Yorkshire litter classes to Donald Swinehart, Quarryville R1.

Judge Harold Setwart, Dauphin County Agent, first place ribbons also to the Chester White Junior Gilt of John Hastings, Jr., and to the Yorkshire senior gilt of Donald Swinehart.
