**Frost Will Soon End Fresh Produce**

Cool night-time temperatures forewarn us that we have but a short time remaining to enjoy so many fresh produce items from nearby farms. An early frost could force cancellation of your plans to can or freeze vegetables, reveals Tom Piper, Penn State Extension Marketing Agent. Better take advantage of these locally grown commodities before Jack Frost arrives.

Some late-season field of sweet corn are now offering a last chance for a corn boil or roast. Tomatoes, beans, eggplant, peppers, summer squash, and most salad items will be gone with the frosts that are not far away. Of course, vegetables will continue to be on the markets, but they will be shipped from other areas and

will probably bear higher prices than those grown near home. Homegrown cabbage, celery, cauliflower and potatoes are plentiful and quite inexpensive to serve.

Fruit fanciers will be happy at the fruit counters this Fall for the choice is wide. Grapes — both the eastern and western grown varieties are now available. Buy them in quantity for juice and jellies. Bartlett pears, bananas, and a growing list of apples, including Summer Rambo, Smokehouse, Jonathan and McIntosh varieties are on the list of good buys this week.

Despite the publicity given to the recent withholding of cattle from the stock yards in the mid-west, supplies of most cuts are adequate. Receipts of live cattle and hogs have

shown an increase over last week; wholesale and retail prices should ease downward but not much this week.

Many stores are expected to feature red meats at promotional prices this week-end. Round steaks, chuck roast and ground beef will be subject to promotion; pork loins and hams may receive similar treatment. Poultry prices are up, influenced greatly by the recent jump in red meat prices.

Storage stocks of cheese are high. This commodity will be subject to promotion during October. Frozen orange juice, rice and cranberries have set new production records this year. Watch for values on these items.
