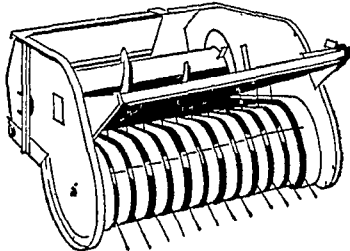
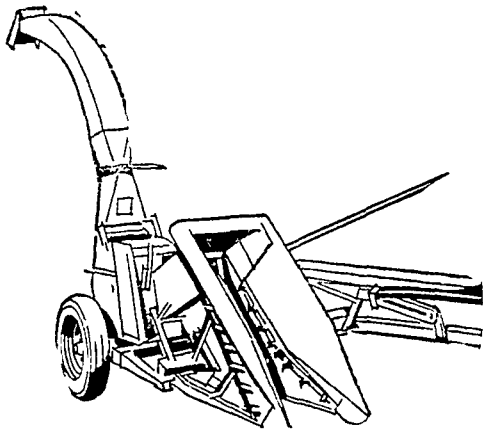
Fresh Holstein cows brought \$275-500, Guernseys were \$175-225, and other breeds \$175-245. Stock bulls brought \$110-185 and stock heifers made \$45-130.

The horse market continued about steady with continued downward pressure on riding horses at the September 17 sale. A total of 227 head were in the run.

Pony mares brought \$75-115 and geldings sold for \$40-110, at \$115-225, and driving horses. Riding horses changed hands were \$115-180. Killers brought 7 to 7 1/2 cents a pound.
