

Co. Dairymen Win Ribbons In State Show

County showmen brought one breed junior championship and two reserve junior championships rosettes home from the state junior dairy show Wednesday at Harrisburg.

Glen A. Musser, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Elias Musser, Mount Joy R1, showed Donald Ivanhoe Robin, a senior yearling, to the reserve junior championship in the Holstein judging. Averil Lindel Royer, 2025 Oregon Pike, won a first place class ribbon with her two year old cow, and Harold J. Brubaker took a first place ribbon in the three year old class.

Stephen Arrowsmith, the son of Mr. and Mrs. William Arrowsmith, Peach Bottom, showed his senior yearling, Hillacres Milkboy Penny, to the junior championship of the Jersey classes. She was the only county Jersey placing in

the state show.

In Ayrshire competition, Jerry Snader, Ephrata R1, took a reserve junior championship with his FFA project senior calf, Masonic Home. Tillie Jerry, the son of Mrs. Eva Snader, also showed a Holstein heifer in the state show.

The two brown swiss junior calves from the county finished one and two in their class but were out of the finals. Joyce Kreider's calf outpointed the calf of Donald Trimble, reversing their standing in the district show last month. Both are from Quarryville R1.

Suzanne Mumma, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Harry Mumma, Manheim R1, was the only county showman to win a first place ribbon with a Guernsey. She also was named master showman in the breed.

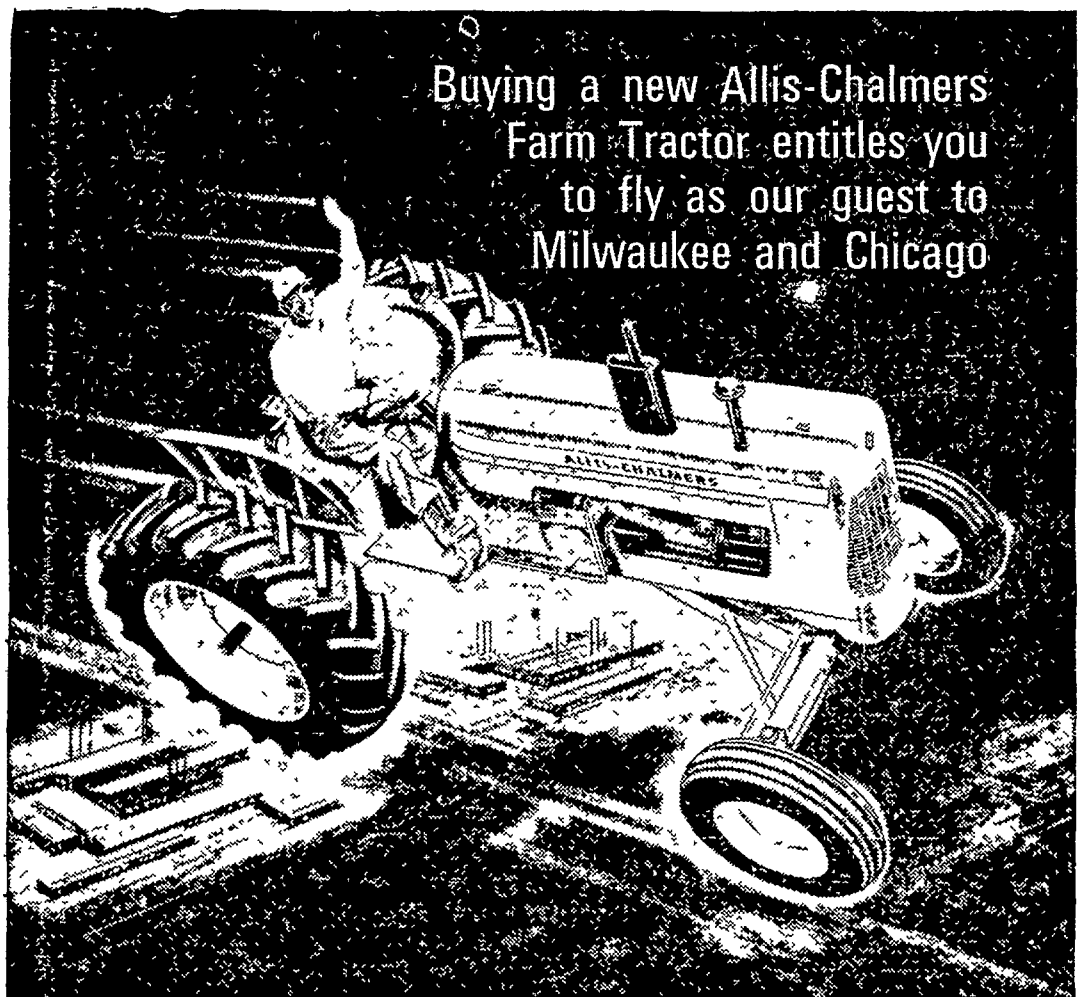
Judging Team Wins 1st Place At Springfield

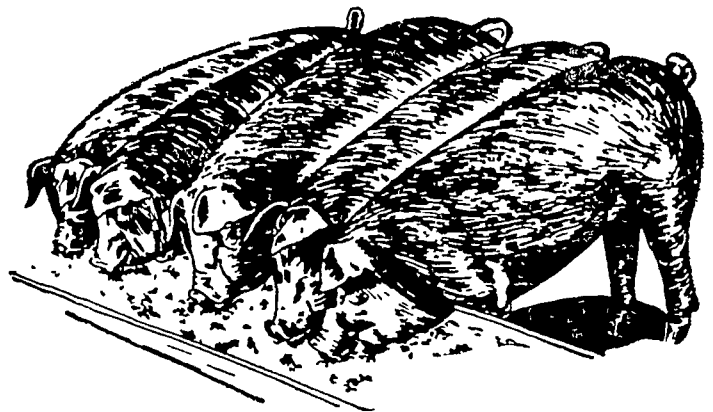
