Changeover To Fall Vegetables

Fall is officially here and the changeover from Summer to Fall vegetables will increase greatly in the next two weeks. Tender vegetables are affected most, observes Tom Piper, Penn State Extension Marketing Agent, who reports that light frosts in some areas have already terminated local production of certain items.

Cabbage, cauliflower, celery, eggplant, endive-escarole, and other leafy greens such as spinach are currently in heavy supply. Harvesting of potatoes, onions and sweet potatoes has progressed with ideal weather conditions; these commodities are in plentiful supply and at the year's lowest prices.

Several other vegetables remain in plentiful supply but often lower in quality than in past weeks. Lettuce, sweet corn, tomatoes and cucumbers should be inspected for quality at point of purchase.

Signs of Autumn are appearing in the form of pumpkins, various winter squash, ornamental gourds and Indian corn. The season's first sweet apple cider is available too.

Numerous good buys exist at the fruit counter. Select from several varieties of apples suitable for cooking or eating fresh. Bartlett pears, red and white grapes and Western melons including Casaba, Cienshaw, Honeydew and Persian varieties are plentiful now. New crop Florida grapefruit are starting to market but opening prices will be high.

Survey sources report meat supplies about normal. Pork, lamb and hindquarter beef cuts are quoting lower at wholesale. Consumers can expect some smoothing of the jagged price peaks of the past few weeks, although change will be slight.

Turkeys, broiler-fryers and seafood top the list of meat values this week-end. Beef pot roast, steaks, and rib roast will appear as featured items in some foodmarket ads; pork steaks and smoked picnics are likewise candidates for promotion.
